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End your week on a high.

This course covers all practical elements for working safely at heights including hazard reporting, harness inspection and use of anchor points. When working at heights it's important to know how to prevent yourself, and others, from heights related injury. Between 2003 and 2015, 359 workers were killed following a fall from a height—11% of all workers killed over this period. Half of these falls involved falling three metres or less.

This course is designed for everyone who is involved in construction, as chances are you have or will be working at heights and need to be able to do so safely.
